Welcome to ***Acts of Kindness***, a collaboration between theatre and science, centred on a new play, *The Altruists*, by Craig Baxter. *The Altruists* is about the lives and ideas of evolutionary biologists, George Price, Bill Hamilton and John Maynard Smith, who explored the genetic basis for human kindness. Set in London during the upheaval of the 1960s and 70s, it centres on George Price whose inspired discoveries coincide with attempts at altruistic living and hallucinatory visions which challenge all those around him. *The Altruists* is a brave new play of big ideas, personal ambition and human frailties which Menagerie will fully produce in 2014-15.

Acts of Kindness is a key part in the development of *The Altruists*. We have partnered with scientists, historians, philosophers and theatre researchers to create 4 events throughout the day. Each event includes an extract from the play performed by a professional cast, followed by presentations from guest researchers whose work intersects with the play's ideas, narrative and themes.

Who are we?

Menagerie Theatre Company is the leading independent new writing theatre company in the East of England. Based in Cambridge, we have been creating theatre for over ten years and have a regional, national and international reputation for the development of first class new writing for the stage. As well as touring widely, we run workshops, writer development courses and produce the annual Hotbed Festival in Cambridge.

The Darwin Correspondence Project, based at the Cambridge University Library, aims to annotate and transcribe Darwin's extraordinarily revealing letters, making them freely available online. To date, the project has located, both in libraries and in private collections, a total of more than 15,000 letters exchanged by Darwin with nearly 2000 correspondents around the world between 1821 and his death in 1882.
